What is an Industry Innovation Project?

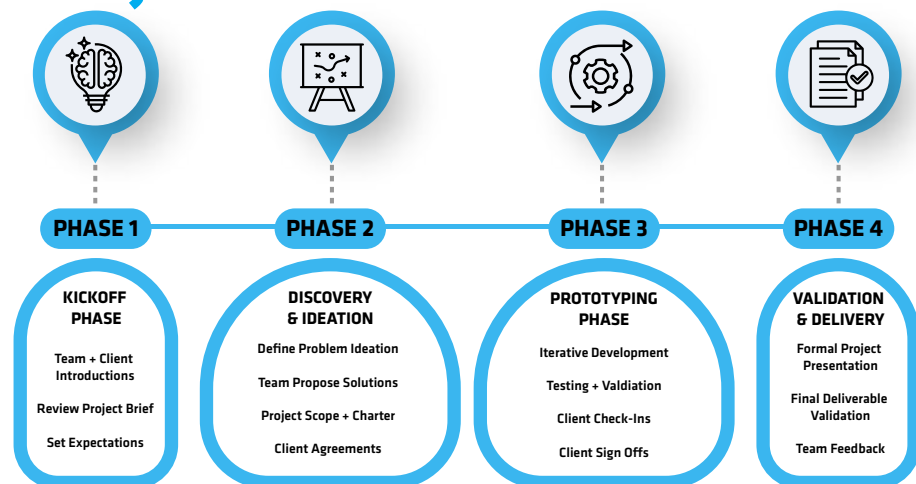
Ready to tackle real-world challenges while earning your degree?

The Master of Digital Media (MDM) is a professional graduate program focusing on collaboration, problem solving, critical thinking, leading and managing, communication, ideation, and innovation. Our Digital Media Practicum offers programming students from different institutions, a collaborative experience working in an interdisciplinary team with industry clients on cutting-edge projects, such as digital installations, games, VR simulations, and educational technologies.

This is not work for hire or an internship/co-op.

Students can choose to apply for our **January – April** term or **May – August** term.

PROJECT TIMELINE



Spring and Summer Term Projects run for 12 weeks, and follow an iterative, agile development model.

Outcomes

At the end of the term, visiting students will:

- Apply agile software design methodologies to develop, iterate, and deliver a prototype of an interactive media product.
- Analyze and address complex design and technical challenges encountered during project development.
- Integrate diverse perspectives and approaches to create novel and impactful interactive media solutions
- Produce an interactive media project suitable for showcasing in a digital media portfolio. Note this is subject to the project client's NDA.
- Develop connections with industry professionals.



What Skills Do I Need?

You will join a 5-7 person team consisting of project managers, artists, designers, and other programmers to tackle a real-world challenge from an industry client. As a visiting student, your role will be a programmer on the team. Unity and Unreal experience is not required but recommended. Depending on your institution, there are different requirements. Please refer to our page for more details. Note: Only short-listed applicants will proceed to an interview.

What Is The Time Commitment?

- Students coming from **within BC** are expected to work in-person on our campus a minimum of 2 days a week from 9AM - 4PM (students are able to choose the days).
- Students coming from **outside of BC** are expected to work in-person on our campus Monday - Thursday from 9AM - 4PM.
